This type of hollow ceramic figurines have been found in sites with presence or Olmec influence in a broad area from central Mexico to southern Gulf Coast. Human infants represent asexual known as "Baby face" or "Cara de bebé" in different body attitudes and gestures. In all observed cranial deformation produces tabular erect "pear head" typical of the Olmecs.
