The original could I have painted in the sixteenth century. By deterioration copies were made in 1665 and 1852.

Geographically Xalapa registers with its old name Macuilxochitlan at Sedeño river as Quetzalapan and elsewhere in the region. It was testimony to the defense of their land, attacked the Spanish presence, and against which the indigenous rebellions broke out in 1526 in Chalcoyan, so they settled in the enclave of Coapan; rebellion in 1529 and in 1531 the Chapultepec Naolinco. This prompted the correaguimiento Chapultepec was founded and moved to Xalapa Calcahualco monastery. In 1555 Fray Buenaventura was transferred to evangelize natives of Misantla in Tonayan, as they called the abandoned ruins of Chapultepec.
